



# Cuban Radio Transcripts

*from the Cuban Heritage Collection at the University of Miami Libraries, Florida*

The newly released Cuban Radio Transcripts collection on microfilm from ProQuest/UMI™ combines two sources—the Miami Radio Monitoring Service and the USIA: Report from Miami—to form a compilation of unedited daily news transcripts from radio station broadcasts in communist Cuba. The transcripts allow researchers to investigate the Cuban government's day-to-day viewpoint on two decades of post-Revolution history.

## Two sources – one complete picture



### The Miami Radio Monitoring Service

Angel V. Fernández founded The Miami Radio Monitoring Service, or MIRAMOS, as it came to be known. Mr. Fernández dutifully produced each transcript of unedited daily news broadcasts from radio stations in communist Cuba in shorthand and in type. Later, he collaborated with Manuel Acebo, J. Ramírez and the Asociación de Taquígrafos Cubanos en el Exilio to complete the transcriptions, which were published daily from November 1, 1962, until June 30, 1982. Also included in each transcript is the date, day of the week, time, and radio station from the original broadcast. MIRAMOS captured the news from principal Cuban radio stations of the day, including:

- El Rápido
- La Voz de Cuba
- Noticiero CMQ
- Radio Liberación
- Radio Progreso
- Radio Rebelde

### USIA: Daily News from the Cuban Radio Report from Miami

As a supplement to the MIRAMOS transcriptions, the Cuban Radio Transcripts collection includes United States Information Agency's (USIA) daily reports covering important events in Cuba from 1963 through 1977, a time of great importance to Cuban and American history.



## Get perspective on some of the most influential Cuban events



The Cuban Radio Transcripts collection provides the researcher with insight into the Cuban government's daily point of view on important world events following the Revolution, including:

- The Cuban reaction following the Bay of Pigs invasion
- President Kennedy's assassination
- Relations between Cuba and the Soviet Union
- The death of Che Guevara

## Multi-disciplinary research value

Transcribed in Spanish and housed on 65 reels of 35mm microfilm, each transcript is dated and marked with the broadcast time, followed by the headline and news report areas. Additionally, MARC records are included free of charge, making this collection a highly useful tool for researchers across multiple disciplines:

- American History
- Latin American Studies
- Media Studies
- Political Science
- Research in propaganda
- Soviet and Communist Studies
- Spanish Language
